

The premises trades as an off-licence. At all material times the Designated Premises Supervisor was Mr Ashok Bharadwaj, and the Premises Licence Holders were Mr Ashok Bharadwaj and Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj.

### 2. Public Safety

A test purchase volunteer aged 14 years and 1 month old was sold alcohol by a person working at Arnold Road Off Licence.

Sales of alcohol to children under the age of 18 can cause concerns of public safety. This could cause intoxicated underaged children to be generally engaging in unsafe behaviour putting themselves, and others at risk. An example of unsafe behaviour due to underage children drinking alcohol could be they could walk into the path of a moving vehicle putting themselves and the motorist at risk. The incorrect disposal of glass alcohol bottles could pose further risks to public safety.

### 3. The Prevention of Public Nuisance

It is alleged that the sale of alcohol to underage children could also cause a public nuisance due to empty cans/bottles being left in the surrounding area as well as possible noise nuisance made by intoxicated underage children. Public urination is also a nuisance.

### 4. The Protection of Children from Harm

The sale of alcohol to children can expose them to a risk to their health and wellbeing, either from the direct effects of consuming alcohol, or either by making them more likely to be the victims, or perpetrators, of violent or sexual crimes.

Mr Ashok Bharadwaj, the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor of Arnold Road Off Licence, is responsible for breaching a mandatory condition of the premises licence, namely S146 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003, in that he sold alcohol to a person under 18 years of age. This sale was witnessed by a member of Trading Standards and gave rise to two prosecution reports where Mr and Mrs Bharadwaj are separate defendants.

### Summary

By reason of the matters aforesaid, it is felt that it would be a necessary and proportionate response of the Nottingham City Council Trading Standards Service to make an application for review of the premises licence.

# Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

On the 26th January 2010, two officers from Trading Standards, and one Police Officer carried out a test purchase exercise with a volunteer aged 14 years and 1 month. Around 6.00pm the volunteer purchased alcohol (WKD Original Vodka Iron Brew) from Arnold Road Off Licence. The sale was witnessed by Elizabeth Hanson, Enforcement Assistant for the Service. After the sale, Ian Tucker (Enforcement Officer for Trading Standards) and PC Chappell Mason returned to the premises and spoke to the seller of the alcohol. The seller, Anil Prakash, was informed of the sale and informed lan Tucker and PC Chappell that he was a member of staff. Further business details were provided by Mr Prakash and he also provided a refusals book that had 5 tobacco refusals entered over period of 11 months, with the last one being entered 3 months before the sale. There were no entries for alcohol refusals produced on the day of the sale, but after the interview with Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj a further refusals record was produced by her which contained alcohol refusals. This second document appeared to be a photocopy of the 1st refusals book that was seen on the day of the sale. It is our view that these documents are an essential part of systems designed to prevent sales of alcohol to under age persons. Of the five test purchases carried out in total that day, the other four premises all refused to sell alcohol to the same test purchase volunteer.

The shop operates a 25 Policy, but Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj said that the seller didn't use the policy at that time as he told her that he thought the young test purchase volunteer looked over 18 years old. A 25 Policy is designed to prevent sales in this circumstance. During the interview with Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj she stated that she authorised her members of staff to sell alcohol, but the DPS as that time, Mr Ashok Bharadwaj, had no knowledge of who worked there. This means that unauthorised sales were made from the premises unless all sales were made by Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj (or specifically authorised by her).

In 2008, a different premises that both Mr and Mrs Bharadwaj were Joint Premises Licence Holders for, had a licence review. The panel at that time revoked the licence due to the evidence that was brought to them by Nottinghamshire Constabulary. This review involved underage children being sold alcohol from ASB News, 21B Mansfield Road with resulting incidents from sales of alcohol including several hospitalisations and a sexual attack. All these incidents involved people under the age of 18 years that had obtained alcohol from ASB News. During the review process, on the basis on which the evidence was submitted, the Panel was satisfied that factually the premises had sold alcohol to persons under the age of 18 on various occasions including:-

25th March 2006
16th April 2007
15th September 2007
1st March 2008
3rd March 2008
4 separate occasions within a 2 hour period on 5th April 2008

### 9 May 2008

Further information relating to the history of the Premises Licence Holders, in relation to the previous Licence Review, can be found within Decision No. 169 - 2008 (a copy of which has been submitted with this Licence Review Application).

On checking our records, we received a complaint in summer 2007 about sales being made to minors from Arnold Road Off Licence. The premises was informed of the complaint.

During the interview process with Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj in March 2010, prior to the tape recording, she stated that Trading Standards were being sexist as we were only interviewing her because she was a woman in business. She did not make this allegation during the recording of the interview.

During the tape recorded interview under caution, on the 15th March 2010 with Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj, she stated that her husband, Mr Ashok Bharadwai, had nothing to do with Arnold Road Off Licence and he has never been there. She also stated that she manages the business on her own. At the time of the sale Mr Ashok Bharadwaj was the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) of Arnold Road Off-Licence (and this is detailed on the Premises Licence, and copy of which is submitted with this Premises Licence Review). Also during Mr Ashok Bharadwaj's interview under caution, on the 21st June 2010, he confirmed that he had never been inside the premises and does not know the name of the members of staff that work there. The role of a DPS has been viewed as the person who has day to day responsibility for the running of the premises. Any premises where alcohol is supplied under a premises licence should have a DPS. During the investigation it was also discovered that they own another licensed premises next door to ASB News. Deva Restaurant, at 19 Mansfield Road, also had both Mr and Mrs Bharadwaj as joint Premises Licence Holders.

During both interviews with the Premises Licence Holders it was stated that Mr Bharadwaj did not know any members of staff that work at Arnold Road Off Licence - 75 Arnold Road, Basford. However, in 2009 a Anil Prakash had made representations in support against a new premises licence application next door to the Bharadwaj's other business, Deva Restaurant on Mansfield Road. Also, the Licence Review in 2008 had supportive signatures from customers of ASB News, and one of these names was Anil Prakash with his address given as 19 Mansfield Road (Deva Restaurant).

Mrs Sushma Bharadwaj was offered a place on the Alcohol Retailers Training Sessions in September 2010, which are free. However, she did not attend and did not call Trading Standards to explain why or to rebook.

Mr and Mrs Bharadwaj have been reported for consideration of prosecution for the sale of alcohol on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2010 as mentioned above and which gives rise for this application for review.

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

### S19 Licensing Act 2003

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

#### **Embedded Restrictions**

### Section 60, 63, 86 Licensing Act 1964 – Off Licence Permitted Hours

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- d. On Good Friday, 8 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered:
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.

### Section 164 Licensing Act 1964

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in, the licensed premises.
