

### Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note 1)

The Licensing Objectives of Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Protection of Children from Harm have been seriously undermined in that:

On 30<sup>th</sup> November 2011 a test purchase volunteer aged 15 years was sold alcohol by a person at Open All Hours, 38 George Street, Nottingham.

### (2) PUBLIC SAFETY

Sales of alcohol to children under the age of 18 can cause concerns of public safety. This could cause intoxicated underage children to engage in unsafe behaviour putting themselves, and others at risk. An example of unsafe behaviour due to underage children drinking alcohol could be whilst in an intoxicated state they walk into the path of a moving vehicle putting themselves and the motorist at risk of injury.

### (3) The PREVENTION of PUBLIC NUISANCE

It is also alleged that the sale of alcohol to underage children could also cause a public nuisance. This could be due to groups of intoxicated children causing anti social behaviour, which has previously been evident in parts of the City. Another by product of children being sold alcohol is litter such as empty cans and bottles being discarded in the area they gather. Again this has been evident in parts of the City.

### (4) The PROTECTION of CHILDREN from HARM

The sale of alcohol to children can expose them to a risk to their health and wellbeing, either:

- by the direct effects to their health of consuming alcohol
- by making themselves more vulnerable to crime in particular those of a violent or sexual nature.
- by becoming in their intoxicated state a perpetrator of crime especially violence.

In this case a child aged 15 years was sold a bottle of Blossom Hill wine, which had an alcohol content of 12%. This is a particular concern as the higher the percentage of alcohol the more likelihood there is that a child's health and well being will be detrimentally affected.

The circumstances of the case are that on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2011 Section 146(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 was breached in that Mr Karpal Singh RATOUR sold the aforementioned alcohol to a person under the age of 18 years of age. This sale was witnessed by a member of Trading Standards. As a consequence Mr RATOUR has been issued with a fixed penalty ticket and a Prosecution Report will be raised in relation to Mr Peter SHEARSTONE who is the sole Premises License Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Open All Hours was subject to a license review in December 2010. This was as a result of a failed test purchase exercise in June 2010 when again they sold alcohol to a person under the age of 18 namely 13 years old. Mr SHEARSTONE was formally cautioned on this occasion but a number of conditions were attached to the premises licence. These included a condition that any person selling alcohol should be fully trained in Licensed Product sales before being authorised to make sales of such products.

On interview Mr SHEARSTONE admitted that Mr RATOUR had not received any training.

#### Summary

By reason of the matters aforesaid, it is felt that it would be a necessary and proportionate response of the Nottingham City Council Trading Standards Service to make an application for a review of the premises licence.

Historical

In March 2009 a complaint was received by Trading Standards that Open All Hours was selling alcohol to persons under the age of 18.

In January 2010 Trading Standards conducted a test purchase exercise in the City Centre and an attempt was made to purchase alcohol at Open All Hours. This however was aborted because the volunteer could not locate the alcohol in the shop.

On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2010 Trading Standards conducted an underage test purchase exercise at the premises and a bottle of 20cl Glen's vodka was sold to a 13 years old child.

On 24<sup>th</sup> July 2010 further information was received from a Special Constable who had seized some fake ID from a 15 years old male. The male informed the officer that he had used the fake ID to purchase alcohol from City Centre shops and specifically named Open All Hours.

On 28<sup>th</sup> July 2010 Mr SHEARSTONE and his then business partner Mr KAREER were interviewed in relation to the underage sale on 30/06/2010. Both subsequently received cautions in relation to this matter.

On 21<sup>st</sup> December 2010 following an application by the Nottingham City Council Trading Standards Service a licensing hearing was held to review the premises licence in respect of Open All Hours. By this time Mr KAREER who was the joint Licensee had sold his share of the business to Mr SHEARSTONE and as a result wished to surrender his personal licence. The Licensing Authority determined that the premises licence should be modified and a number of new conditions were imposed on it. These included:

- (1) Any person selling alcohol to have been fully trained in Licensed Product sales before being authorised to make sales of such products.
- (2) A challenge 25 policy to operate at the premises. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall not be sold alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of identification (e.g Passport, Driving licence or PASS accredited card).

On 30<sup>th</sup> November 2011 Trading Standards conducted a further underage test purchase exercise in the City Centre. In total thirteen premises were visited and only one failed that being Open All Hours. At 13:34 hours that day (30/11/2011) two 15 year old girls entered the shop. One of them selected a bottle of Blossom Hill wine with an alcohol content of 12%. This was presented at the till point. The seller; Mr Karpal Singh RATOUR; and the only person in the shop at that time did not ask for any ID or challenge the child's age. He merely sold the wine to the girl without any question. The sale was witnessed by a Trading Standards officer who was present in the shop with the two girls. Mr RATOUR was issued with a fixed penalty ticket.

On 5<sup>th</sup> December 2011 Peter SHEARSTONE was interviewed by Pc Wheddon and Rosie Bielby (Trading Standards). He admitted that on 30/11/2011 he had left Mr RATOUR in charge of the shop whilst he went to the bank. He admitted that Mr RATOUR had had no formal training in licensed product sales. He said he was just a friend who was helping him out. He said when he left the shop he reminded Mr RATOUR about the challenge 25 policy. He was shown the photograph of the two volunteers and said that he would imagine they were 15 or 16. He said they should

have been challenged. This is a clear breach of both the aforementioned conditions. Mr SHEARSTONE has been reported for summons for the sale of alcohol on 30/11/2011, which gives rise to this review application.

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

### S.19 Licensing Act 2003

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### S19 (4) Licensing Act 2003

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained in accordance with the recommendations of Police Licensing Officers. Images shall be retained for 31 days and made available to the Police or other authorised Officers.

### Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

(Reviewed: 21 December 2010)

- 1. No alcohol to be sold at the premises by any person under the age of 18 years old;
- 2. Any person selling alcohol to have been fully trained in Licensed Product sales before being authorised to make sales of such products;
- 3. A Challenge 25 policy to operate at the premises. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall not be sold alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of identification (e.g. Passport driving Licence or PASS accredited card);
- 4. Suitable notices concerning the Challenge 25 policy to be prominently displayed in the premises for customers and in positions which act as a till prompt for staff;
- 5. Suitable notices to be prominently displayed at the premises for customer's information to confirm that alcohol will not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years old;
- 6. A bound and sequentially paginated refusals book shall be kept to record all refusals to sell alcohol. This book was to be made available to the Police or Responsible Authorities upon immediate request of either and retained on the premises for at least 12 months:
- A full written record of all training of staff to be kept at the premises and a refresher training course undertaken every 12 months by individual members of staff by attending one of the approved Nottingham Trading Standards Department licensing courses;
- 8. If the premises adopt the EPOS System, that system must prompt staff at the point of sale, to the fact that the sale involves an age restricted product.
