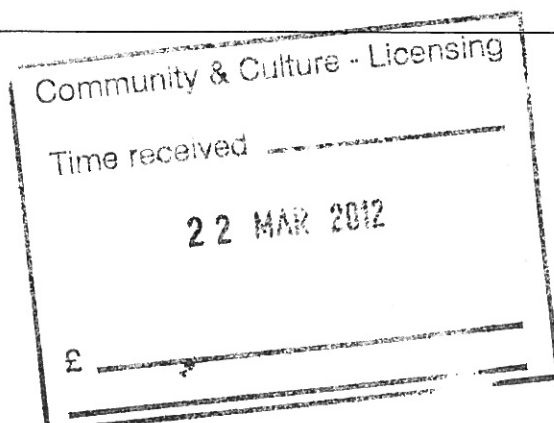

The circumstances leading to this application are as aforementioned in that:

On 19/10/2011 & 09/11/2011 Trading Standards Officers carried out inspections of the Premier General Store 27-28 Tanners Walk, Broadmarsh Centre, Nottingham. The initial visit was as a direct result of a complaint received from a member of the public who had become ill after having consumed vodka purchased from the shop. On both occasions vodka was found that was either of a standard not fit for human consumption or had counterfeit labels affixed to it indicating that it had been smuggled into the UK to avoid import tax.

During the inspection on 19/10/2011 the following was seized:

- 6 x 35cl bottles of Artic Ice vodka,
- 2 x 1 litre bottles of Russian Standard vodka,
- 2 x 1 litre bottles of 5 Lakes vodka
- 31 x 70 cl bottles of Artiv vodka

All of the above was on sale to the public. They are not recognised brands within the UK. All had labels on them stating the alcohol content was 37.5%.

Forensic examination showed that the alcohol content of the Artic Ice was 51.5% proof substantially over the strength showed on the bottle. All the other brands were under strength. This is not only misleading to the public but directly contravenes the Food labelling Regulations 1996.

More alarming was that both the Artic Ice and Russian Standard also had considerably high levels of methanol. The Artic Ice was 27 times higher than the maximum permitted level whilst the Russian Standard was 18 times higher than the maximum permitted limit.

The laboratory report relating to both the Artic Ice and the Russian Standard state that the high methanol levels indicate that the product is not genuine vodka and also that the drink is so contaminated that it is unfit for consumption.

On 09/11/2011 a further inspection was made and bottles of Glens Vodka were seized. Enquiries revealed that these bottles had been legitimately produced by Glens for the export market and as such the back labels did not incorporate a UK Duty Stamp. The ones recovered from the Premier General Store did have such a stamp on them. This means the original labels had been removed and replaced by counterfeit ones in a deliberate attempt to avoid paying duty on them. This is a clear indication that they had been smuggled into the UK.

The licence for the premises is held in joint names – Mr Cethan Patel & Mr Bhavin Kothari.

On 27/01/2012 Mr Cethan Patel was interviewed. He stated that he was the licence holder for the Premier General Store and he alone was responsible for buying stock. He stated that all the vodka seized on 19/10/2010 he had purchased from a company called D & G Limited who he believed were from London. He said that a man visited the store offering to supply a variety of beers and spirits. He said the man was foreign, possibly Turkish. He agreed to make a purchase and subsequently the products were delivered. He said he paid the man £1,375.78 in cash. Mr Patel provided an invoice to prove this.

He said he had not been able to contact them since.

He agreed that the products were substantially cheaper than he usually paid. He described the male as being a foreign male.

He said normally he would get his stock from Booker Ltd. He claimed this is where he purchased the Glens vodka subject of the seizure on 09/11/2011. He produced invoices from Booker Ltd showing purchases of Glen's vodka.

On 23/02/2012 Mr Bhavin Kothari was interviewed. He said that he no longer had any involvement in the Premier General Store. He said his name needed to be taken off the licence. He stated that he and his cousin (Mr Patel) had split the business in two and he now looked after a store in Hucknall.

He said he left the business about 6 months ago. He denied having any involvement in purchasing any stock for the Broadmarsh Centre Store.

Since the interviews, enquiries have been made to trace D & G Limited at the address on the invoice supplied by Mr Patel. The company does not exist.

Enquiries have also been made with Booker Ltd who state that Glens Vodka is supplied directly to them from the distilleries bonded warehouse. That being the case the vodka seized from the Premier General Store on 09/11/2011 was not supplied by them and could only have come from the black market.

#### Summary

As aforementioned it is felt that it would be a necessary and proportionate response of the Nottingham City Council Trading Standards Service to make an application for a review of the premises licence.
