(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); . (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; . 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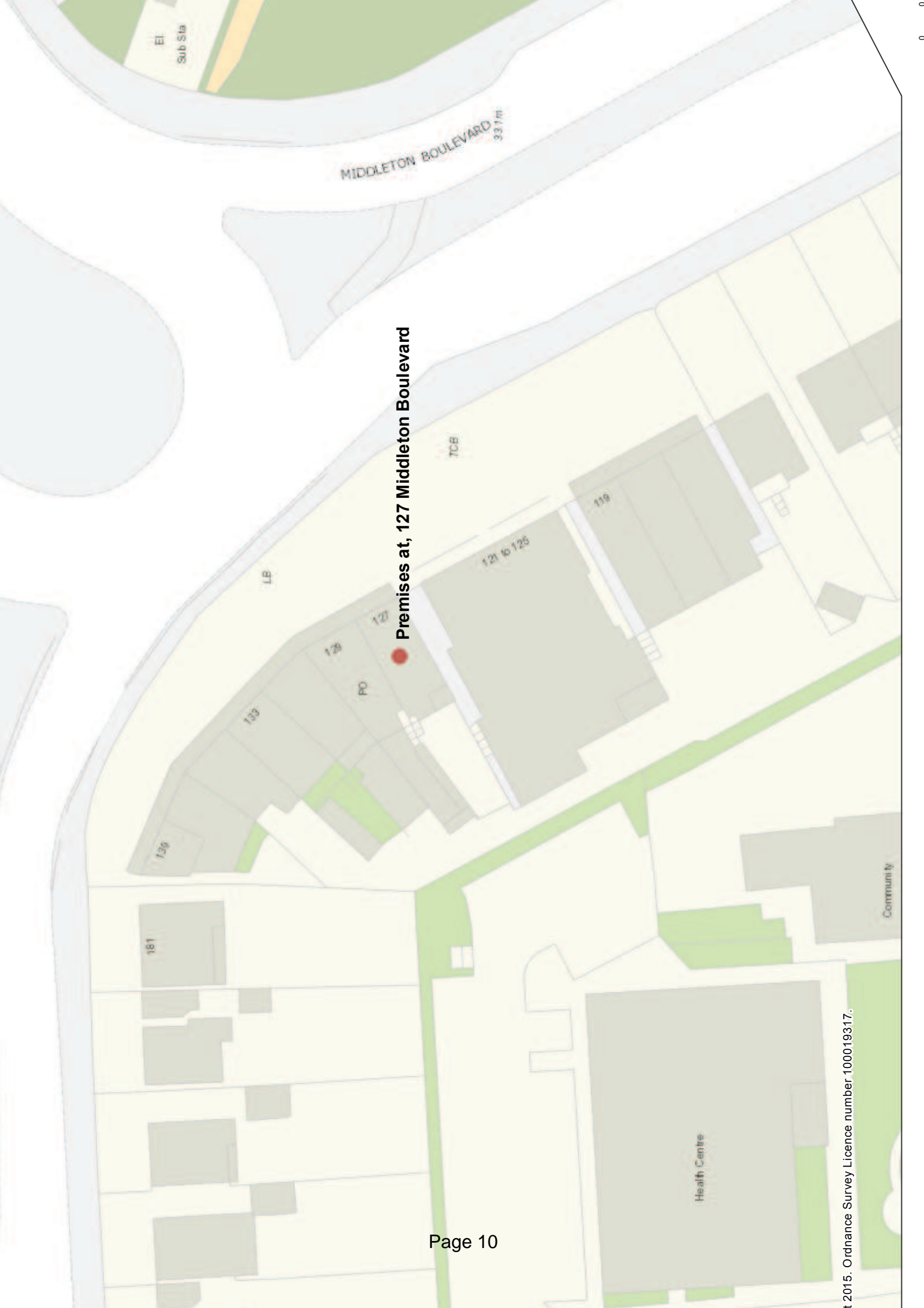

All recordings used in conjunction with CCTV shall: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be of evidential quality in all lighting conditions; • Indicate the correct time and date; and • Be retained for a period of 31 consecutive days. <p>A member of staff trained to use the system must be on duty at all times as the recorded images must be made available for inspection and downloading immediately upon request to officers of Responsible Authorities.</p> 2. All images downloaded from the CCTV system must be provided in a format that can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software 3. A bound and sequentially paginated incident/accident book or electronic record must be kept to record all instances of disorder, damage to property and personal injury at the premises. Such records must be made available for inspection and copying by the Police and other officers of Responsible Authorities immediately upon request. A Challenge 25 scheme must operate at the premises. Any person who appears to be under 25 years of age shall not be served alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of identification (passport, photo driving licence, Military Identity card or PASS accredited card).</p> <p>7. Challenge 25 notices must be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises.</p> <p>8. All spirits must be displayed behind the sales counter.</p>



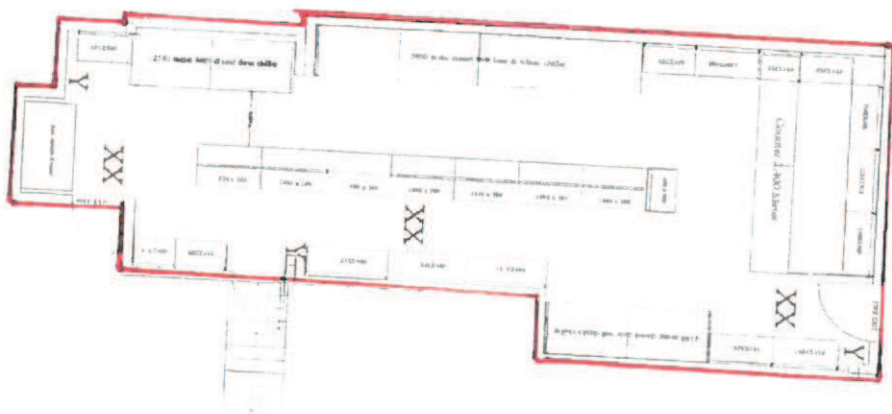
