Decision Being Taken:

To agree the 'Children at the Heart' Improvement Plan and phased Improvement Plan funding.

Reasons for the Decision(s)

The 'Children at the Heart' Improvement Plan has two priority areas of focus: 1) Social Work Practice (to address the systemic failures in social work practice to ensure that planning and intervention for children improve their experiences and that new and emerging risks are identified and responded to); and 2) Workforce Capacity (to stabilise the workforce and address the significant shortfall in capacity to enable social workers and first-line managers to respond effectively to children in need of help and protection). The Improvement Plan is in response to the two priority actions that followed an Ofsted focused visit in February 2020. Wider recommendations were also made around the practice improvements that need to be delivered, we are committed to achieving improvements at the pace required to ensure that all children receive the same standard of help and protection that they need. The improvements we need to make require concerted and effective improvement activity over a sustained period, and it is clear that swift improvements need to be achieved in order to secure demonstrable impact on outcomes for children in the City. The 'Children at the Heart' Improvement Plan supports clear prioritisation of activity to enable us to embed practice improvements over the next six to eighteen months.

Legal Advice:

There are no particular legal comments in relation to the plan, the aim of which is to discharge statutory duties effectively, including those under Parts IV and V of the Children Act 1989.

Finance Advice:

The decision requires approval to spend an additional £1,576,000 in accordance with the 'Children at the Heart' Improvement Plan. This is in addition to the budget allocation captured in the Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP). The Improvement Plan aims to address the shortfalls identified following the recent Ofsted focus visit. The table below provides a summary of costs associated with each phase of the plan to address two key priorities:

Phase One - £176,000 Phase Two - £1,400,000 TOTAL: £1,576,000

The costs identified aim to: 1) address the systemic failures in social work practice to ensure that planning and intervention for children improves their experiences, and that new and emerging risks are identified and responded to; and 2) stabilise the workforce and address the significant shortfall in capacity to enable social workers and first-line managers to respond effectively to children in need of help and protection.

The above costs will form part of the Children's Integrated Services department. Spend will be recorded, monitored and reported to the 'Children at the Heart' Improvement Board. The additional expenditure will impact on the organisation's MTFP and increase the budget gap going forward. Failure to address the shortfalls identified could create material risks for the organisation. Further approval is required if costs over and above this decision are identified.
