1. BACKGROUND AND PROPOSALS

a) PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNANCE PROGRAMME 2014/15

The Participation in Governance programme supports children and young people to participate in decision making in the Children's Partnership.

This programme consists of meetings, events and group work aimed at empowering children and young people to participate alongside decision makers for the Children Partnership and contribute to the design, development and delivery of strategies and plans for service improvement. The programme is refreshed annually.

The programme provides a thematic schedule to enable partners to plan engagement and participation with various participation groups and engage larger number of children and young people through Youth Council and Primary Parliament events.

Participation in Governance Groups

Youth Cabinet

Youth Cabinet meetings are held monthly at on the first Wednesday of the month. Youth Cabinet provides a reference group forum for partners including Councillors, senior officers from the Children's Partnership and voluntary sector service providers. Partners are invited to come to Youth Cabinet to discuss and design participation plans and strategies, and to consult on programme performance. Members contribute to a wide variety of governance boards and projects including Children's Partnership Board, Nottingham Growth Board, One Nottingham forum, Equality and Fairness Commission, STAC Education and Training Group and the Creative Industries Award.

UK Youth Parliament

Nottingham City sends two MYP and two Deputy MYP representatives to regional and national meetings of the UK Youth Parliament, including the annual House of Commons sitting.

Elections for Nottingham City UK Youth Parliament representatives were held through National Citizen Service programme this summer. Five candidates from the Youth Cabinet stood for elections and produced short manifestos outlining their priorities for change. 385 young people took part in voting. The candidates returned as UK Youth parliament representatives for 2014/15 were Charlotte Croft and Rachel To.

Children in Care Council

The Children in Care Council is convened to support CiC and Care Leavers to participate in decision making with the Corporate Parenting Board. The group meets monthly and consists of around 12 care experienced young people from a range of care backgrounds. The group is a key partner in the annual Have Your Say survey of CiC and Care Leavers and its recommendations for improvement are used to inform the annual Corporate Parenting Action Plan.

The Special People Group

The Special People Group is a participation forum for young people with special educational needs and disabilities, currently convened on our behalf by Barnardo's. The group meets

monthly and currently acts as the principal young people's co-production forum for the Children and Families SEN Act reforms.

Youth Council and Primary Parliament

Youth Council

Youth Council is a large general meeting of young people from across the city, held once a term at the Council House. Meetings are themed and involve focussed activity workshops as well as activities to develop participation skills. Each session concludes with a presentation of workshop findings and a chaired discussion with Councillor Mellen, Portfolio Holder for Children Services. Findings are shared with relevant partners, JSNA and children's commissioning colleagues, and Children's Partnership Board.

Partners are invited to submit ideas and material for workshops in advance through the Youth Cabinet.

Primary Parliament

Held termly, these meetings are for Year 5 and 6 children and are organised in conjunction with the Nottingham Learning Trust. The meetings have the same thematic content as Youth Council but workshop activities are different and age appropriate. Meetings conclude with presentation of findings and a chaired discussion with Councillor Mellen, Portfolio Holder for Children Services.

b) UPDATE ON YOUTH CABINET WORK

- Following the successful delivery of the NEEC Youth Conference earlier this year in July Youth cabinet undertook a reciprocal trip to Newcastle to meet with the Newcastle Youth Council and do research into science and technology engagement. The group visited the Centre for Life Science Centre and spoke to organisers about how the centre engages children and families in science and technology learning, The findings from this will feedback into STEMWORKS action plan for science communication.
- While in the North East the group also visited the Baltic centre and took part in workshops to develop the new Sharing the Future participation model which is being used by the Youth Cabinet to help partners plan participation activities.
- Youth Cabinet is now a reference group for the new Early Citizen framework for children and young people's mental health and emotional well-being. Early Citizen is being developed by the Institute of Mental Health at the University of Nottingham on behalf of the Health and Wellbeing Board. An initial focus group session has been held with the programme lead and Youth Cabinet has been included in the coproduction plan for the work.
- Every Christmas Youth Cabinet helps plan and deliver Pies and Pledges, the annual celebration of children, young people and family participation in Nottingham. This year we are proposing to change the focus of the event to be around science and technology, launch of the STEMWORKS action plan and promote opportunities for

science and technology learning and careers in the city. The provisional date for this event is December 2nd and partners are invited to help us plan and deliver this event.
