Safer	Reduce burglaries Cycling on pavement	 Operation Graduate and Coconing has been taking place from Sep, ongoing. The aim is to reduce burglaries by Police being visible when patrolling. From the end of Sep the Police have been giving crime prevention advice on Lenton Drives and targeting houses which have been burgled across Dunkirk and Lenton. Targeting offenders continues. Nottm Uni have been working with Police on door-to-door campaign on burglary, support Op Graduate, send burglary emails to streets where a burglary has taken place, supporting Student Watch pilot and social media messaging throughout Operations on hold during the Tram Works, CPO's are stopping and issuing warning and advise to cyclists. Once Tram works are completed and signage is clearer, TOR's (FPN's) will be issued. Police Swap a Lock scheme will be delivered at Dunkirk Community Centre. Cycling stands have been installed on Derby Road and Lenton Blvd. 'Green corridor ongoing, creating a green corridor between Lenton flats site /Sandfield across to Radford and canal.
