| Decision Being Taken:       | To approved the final contract extension, as permitted in tender CPU1692 Transfer station and waste disposal in line with the current contract provision.   |
| Reasons for the Decision(s) | The current contract allows for a final year extension, April 2021 - March 2022, but requires approval for this final year extension with Stanton Recycling. The Council has a statutory duty under as a Waste Disposal Authority (Unitary Authority) under the Environment Protection Act (EPA) 1990 to arrange the dispose of waste collected on its behalf. There is a current contract in place to treat this and other waste streams. This contract supports public Realm operations to the north and west of the city, allowing waste to be disposed of locally and as part of the council's ambition to reduce its carbon impact reduce travel miles The original decision only covered the value for the first 4 years whilst the procurement was for a total, including extensions, of 5 years. as a result in line with procurement and financial regulations further approval is required. |

The purpose of this report is to secure the necessary budget for this extended period. The Council, has a number of statutory duties in respect of waste collection and disposal this contract ensures continuing compliance with statutory obligations and is therefore supported.
