**Decision Being Taken:** 

To dispense with contract procedure Rule 4.1.1 in accordance with Financial Regulation (3.29) (Operational Issues) to allow for a direct award of contract, to develop specialist business cases to increase the energy efficiency of public buildings in the Midlands Energy Hub area, to OnGen and OnEfficiency.

Reasons for the Decision(s) The Midlands Energy Hub is looking to procure two online feasibility and asset management tools (OnGen and OnEfficiency) as a part of its role to support Local Authorities identifying low carbon projects and renewable energy opportunities. On Gen and On Efficiency are online tools that produce reports on energy generation and efficiency feasibility. They allow a user to take informed investible decisions and the best route for net zero for a specific building. These are cloud-based tools into which information is inputted, and thus they can create the reports needed at a significant speed and reduced cost. OnGen and OnEfficiency are both efficient methods to identify opportunities for carbon reduction, energy cost savings and energy efficiency and have great potential to support Local Authorities across the Midlands in the delivery of public sectordecarbonisation. We are looking to deliver 100 of these energy generation and efficiency reports through the OnGen and OnEfficiency platforms. These will be allocated equally across the LEP areas covered by the Midlands Energy Hub. The Midlands Energy Hub officers will be working with LEPs as well as County and District Councils to best identify the assets to complete reports on; the information needed is light but will be compiled and inputted by the project officers. We expect the reports to deliver a clear road-map of investible options for a building. An additional aim of this work will be to turn the reports into a pipeline of potential projects for the Midlands Energy Hub to support with. This all contributes to the net zero ambitions of the Local Authorities and LEP's across the Midlands. There is £20,000 grant funding offered from the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) that is linked to phase 2 of piloting the OnGen and OnEfficiency online tool, BEIS have already run the tool with the North East Energy Hub and would like to investigate further the effectiveness of the tool. The remaining funds (£26,040) would come from the Midlands Energy Hubs own consultancy fund that is fully funded by BEIS, this spend has been reviewed and signed off by the Hub Steering Group.

## Other Options Considered:

Not accepting the funding - This would result in a missed opportunity to support Local Authorities throughout the Midlands region decarbonise and work towards a green recovery. We would also lose the opportunity to work with BEIS on the joint working pilot with North East Energy Hub and ourselves. Therefore this option was rejected.
