**Independent Medical Assessments for Mobility Card Applicants** 

**Total Value:** 

£200,000 (Type: Revenue)

**Decision Being Taken:** 

- 1) To procure a 3-year contract for carrying out the Independent Medical Assessment for Mobility Card holders and applicants, with the option for a 1 year + 1 year extension (3+1+1 years).
- 2) To delegate authority to the Corporate Director for Growth and City Development to award the contract to the successful supplier, following the tender process.
- 3) To fund the project from the money received from the Department for Transport (DfT) for concessionary fares.

Reasons for the Decision(s)

The Council has a statutory obligation to provide concessionary travel passes to eligible residents with qualifying disabilities as part of the English National Concessionary Travel Scheme. Qualifying disabilities are defined by the DfT guidelines. The Council also has discretionary powers to provide companion passes to some Mobility Concessionary cardholders whereby an unnamed assistant can travel free of charge with the Mobility Citycard holder within the City's administrative area. DfT guidelines advise the use of an independent medical assessment in order to achieve consistency of applicant assessments, together with the use of certain qualifying evidence.

Other Options Considered:

To not send Mobility applicants for an independent assessment and ask applicants to have their application form signed and disabilities verified by their own doctors: the Council used this approach before 2012 and, unfortunately, it lead to a number of abuses of the system, where around 50% of applications granted did not meet the criteria for the Mobility bus pass, even though the applicants were verified as eligible by their own doctors. For this reason, this option is rejected.

## **Finance Advice:**

This procurement decision is expected to cost £200,000 over the 3 year contract, with an option to a 1+1 year extension, and spans over financial years 2021/22 to 2025/26. Year 1 costs have been estimated at £80,000 with a £30,000 per year cost thereafter during years 2-5. The cost of this decision will be contained within the Concessionary Fare Services' core budget and therefore will not have no impact on the Councils' Medium-Term Financial Plan. It is the responsibility of the Head of Public Transport to ensure that value for money is achieved when selecting the preferred supplier.
