Reasons for Decision and Background Information

The scheduled Wollaton Hall temporary exhibition programme includes the loan of 20 micro-sculptures from Dr Willard Wigan MBE as part of the free Natural History Museum's offer. The temporary exhibition will run from April to October 2023 in the South State Suite at Wollaton Hall and the whole exhibition is grant funded by the Arts Council England's NPO grant funding. The loan of the sculptures amounts to £35,000 for seven months. Whilst this would normally mean three quotes need to be sourced because this is unique artwork only created by one particular artist it is not feasible to get two other quotes. Therefore, approval is sought to raise an order for the loan fee without two further quotes.

Other Options Considered and why these were rejected

Do nothing would mean no temporary exhibition at Wollaton Hall which will impact on visitor figures and secondary spend. The Museums Service have visitor figure and income generation targets to meet, increased annually, to ensure the sites' remain sustainable. Reducing the visitor offer (ie no temporary exhibitions) will impact negatively on repeat visitor figures and culminate in reduced secondary spend. Also, the Willard Wigan exhibition is grant funded so does not impact on core Council budgets. Therefore the option to do nothing has been rejected.

Reasons why this decision is classified as operational

The exhibition programme at Wollaton Hall is an annual operational programme, part of the daily running of the site. The Willard Wigan exhibition has been preapproved as part of the delivery for the Museum Service within the 2022-2023 business plan and the expenditure has been pre-approved as part of the delivery of the ACE NPO 2022-2023 programme.
