## Section 1 – Equality Impact (NCC staff/ Service users/ Citizen/ Community impact)

### 1. a. Brief description of proposal/ policy/ service to be assessed

Nottingham City Council, Enviroenergy are seeking to implement a tariff increase from 01<sup>st</sup> January 2023. The tariff increase will be for all domestic and commercial heat and private wire customers. A tariff review takes place typically on an annual basis for domestic customers, commercial tariff increases are implemented as per the terms and conditions of the contract in place. NCC Enviroenergy have seen increased costs from the wholesale markets for utility supplies, the cost of materials and increased maintenance costs.

**Domestic Heat:**

An additional 3½p per day on the Standing Charge and 1¾p per kWh on the Unit Rate. This represents an overall increase of 22% for the average Enviroenergy customer, with an additional weekly cost of £1.73 per week and matches the equivalent Energy Price Guarantee “All-in” price offered by government to national domestic gas users.

**Domestic Electricity:**

Increase the Standing Charge by 14p per day and the Unit Rate by 12p per kWh. Overall, this is a 75% increase, at an additional average weekly cost of £4.70. The increase is 20% below the Unit Rate of the Energy Price Guarantee offered by government to domestic electricity consumers.

**Commercial Heat**

Where applicable, apply the appropriate contractual indexation provision.

Where not applicable, apply a universal “All in” charge which is less than the Energy Bill Relief Scheme.

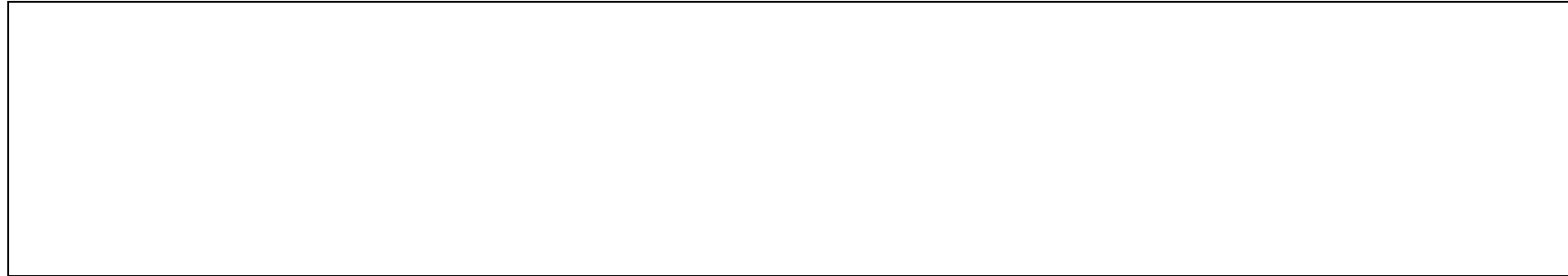
**Commercial Electricity:**

Where applicable, apply the appropriate contractual indexation provision.

Where not applicable, apply a universal “All in” charge which matches the unit rate of the Energy Bill Relief Scheme for businesses but applies a bespoke Use of System charge reflecting Enviroenergy electrical maintenance costs.

**Exceptions:**

To be applied to charity customers and customers which have a separate contractual Standing Charge and Unit Rate.



### **1. b. Information used to analyse the equalities implications**

Analysis of the current utility market volatility has been completed, the proposed domestic price increase will still see the unit rate (kWh) fall below the price cap for gas kWh unit rate, and this is the same for the electric unit rate. The commercial price increase will see the prices rise in line with current market prices but still offer a lower unit rate than a gas Kwh unit rate as is the case for the electric unit rate.

Analysis into the support available has shown that NCC have secured funding through the household support fund. This funding has made available over 10,000 fuel vouchers per year over the last 2 years to support residents with rising fuel costs. A further round of funding is being made available to residents from 01<sup>st</sup> November 2022.
