Decision Taken

To provide for the operation of a bus service for Silverdale and Wilford between April and October 2022, following withdrawal of a commercial service, until a formal tender for a replacement can be completed.

Reasons for Decision and Background Information

These services are commercial withdrawals from 30th April 2022, and will mean that citizens do not have access to a public transport service which is contrary to the Council Plan commitment to provide a comprehensive network. Longer term alternatives to provide this service will be investigated while the emergency service is in operation. A potential funding source for the longer term provision of this service should also become available in that time – the Council has been awarded an indicative £11m from the Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) for the years 2022/23 – 2024/25 but the funding is expected to be confirmed in late summer.

It is expected that a tender procurement exercise will follow, to replace the service from 1st November 2022.

Other Options Considered and why these were rejected

If there is no provision of a replacement bus service, areas of Wilford and all of Silverdale will be left without any public transport service. This would go against

the Council Plan commitment to ensure all citizens have access to a service through the provision of a comprehensive public transport network.

Reasons why this decision is classified as operational

The value of the decision is under £150,000 and is within agreed Council policies and budgets. The decision is an interim spend arrangement, to ensure that residential areas can continue to have a bus service until formal tendering arrangements can be completed for a replacement service.

Additional Information

The ward councillors for Clifton West ward were fully informed of the situation at a meeting in April 2022.

At this time, an EIA is not considered necessary as there will be no change to the service provided.
