Replacement Telematics System

Total Value:

£500,000 (Type: Capital and Revenue)

Decision Being Taken:

- 1. To approve the spend of £500,000 to replace the vehicle and plant telematics system over a total period of 4 years (2 years + 1 year + 1 year).
- 2. To seek approval to go out to 'Mini Competition' and award a contract to one provider via Crown Commercial Services (CCS) framework agreement.
- 3. To delegate authority to the director of Resident Services to award the contract and for the Head of Service for Fleet and Depot Operations to sign the contract.

- Reasons for the Decision(s) 1. To ensure the provision of the services which are compliant with EU procurement legislation and the Councils procurement rules.
 - 2. To enable the Council to access market competitive prices.
 - 3. To ensure commercial and financial risks to the Council are mitigated by the framework terms and conditions.
 - 4. The framework lists approved suppliers chosen through a qualitative and pricing competition which Nottingham City Council is permitted to access as a contracting authority.
 - 5. A DPIA is now in place for telematics systems and any new system must comply with the recommendations set out in the DPIA document
 - 6. The current system is now out of contract meaning a tender is required to ensure any new provider meets best value
 - 7. Service areas have a requirement to retain use of the systems to enable an efficient service to be maintained for our citizens
 - 8. A telematics system is a vital management tool for the Council giving the following benefits:
 - Provide additional protection to employees by assisting the management of occupational road risk to meet our health and safety responsibilities by monitoring driving time and potential fatigue, whilst offering in-cab coaching and training to drivers
 - Reduce carbon emissions (CN28) and improve air quality based on utilisation data, to challenge culture and driver behaviour for example vehicle idling time and routing
 - Capital expenditure reduction vehicle replacement planning and vehicle utilisation and optimisation to provide evidence for the purchasing decision vs rental
 - Reduce costs associated with the maintenance of vehicles mileage and route planning impact on service internals
 - Assist with the recovery vehicles with the location of vehicles that have broken down or have been stolen via live GPS data
 - Record drivers' hours to evidence of compliance with the Road Transport Directive, required for NCC O-Licence
 - Help safeguard employees against vexatious complaints and allegations through GPS information including speed, direction of travel and vehicle controls
 - Assist in work planning and operations (e.g. planning routes and schedules, reducing mileage, knowing which vehicle is closest to an emergency, making best use of vehicles, sweeper brush and mower blade productivity etc.)
 - Provide information on who is responsible for a vehicle at all times to help meet the requirements of the Goods Vehicle Operator's Licence
 - Provide information on driver behaviour to improve safety including speeding and seatbelt infringements
 - Assist in protecting the Council and its employees from claims arising from such incidents involving any Road Traffic Accidents (RTA)

Other Options Considered:

- 1. Renew with current contractor via direct award: rejected as this would not provide best value to NCC as specification has changed and NCC are required to test to market due to being 4 years since previous award
- 2. End current telematics requirements and not renew or use telematics moving forward: rejected as Fleet have a requirement to track vehicles and evidence compliance for the purposes for the operator's licence
