Decision Being Taken:

1. Delegate Authority to the Corporate Director of Development and Growth to accept £899,044 of supplementary "BSIP+" funding to support the delivery of the Network Enhancement, U22s Ticketing and Care Leavers revenue workstreams of the Greater Nottingham Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) profiles as £445,022 in 2023/24 & £445,022 in 2024/25.2. Delegate Authority to the Corporate Director of Development and Growth to submit the required Project Adjustment Request to the Department for Transport to release the BSIP+ funding and (ii) enter into any further variation to the original MOU and grant determinations required by the DfT.3. Delegate Authority to the Corporate Director of Development and Growth to Grant Award local bus operators using transport demiminis powers or tendered contracts to deliver frequency enhancements, route extensions, service support, Extension of U22s Ticketing Scheme reimbursement or the current public transport care leavers scheme as required.

Reasons for the Decision(s) Nottingham City Council has been awarded an additional £899k by the Department for Transport (DfT) to complement the £11.3m already awarded to support the delivery of the Greater Nottingham Bus Service Improvement Plan in 2023/24 & 2024/25. Full Executive Board approval for the Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) was secured in October 2022 and subject to the acceptance of the Project Adjustment Request by the DfT this funding will be used to support and enhance at risk commercial bus services through a combination of direct award grant arrangements and a full procurement exercise and provide additional funding to the current U22s and Care Leavers Ticketing Schemes. Expenditure of the the money in this way is consistent with the the DfTs guidance in relation to how this additional "top-up" funding to the original BSIP grant should be utilised as outlined in the attached BSIP+ confirmation letter and Greater Nottingham Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU). This Leader's Key Decision is required urgently rather than the standard 28 days' notice as the DfT deadline to submit the Project Assessment Request to confirm the BSIP+ funding has already passed and there is an urgency to use this money to support bus service procurement this Autumn. An extension to the DfT Project Assessment Request Deadline has been sought, but it remains expedient to the accelerate the decision making timeline in order to meet the bus service procurement deadlines.

Other Options Considered:

Not accept the BSIP+ funding. This option has been rejected as this funding is required in 23/24 & 24/25 to ensure that current levels of bus service are maintained across the local bus network and to preserve critical social and economic connectivity for local communities. Without this funding 9 commercial bus service would be at risk of serious curtailment or withdrawal. Reduced levels of service and frequency would make these bus services less attractive, disadvantage existing users, make patronage growth and recovery even more challenging and depress fare income - impacting the long term viability of the services.
