Decision Being Taken:	To approve the procurement process for catering Heavy Equipment contract up to the value of £700,000 over 10 years. ( approx £70,000 per year).To Delegate authority to the Director of Education services to award contracts for 10 years to have an open dynamic purchasing agreement in place. This agreement allows suppliers to apply, meet the required standards and then be approved to receive orders from Nottingham City Council. There is not a guarantee of or commitment to spend under the terms of the DPS. To note that the spend has been approved by the Spend Control Board, ref. 3886.

Reasons for the Decision(s)	Nottingham City Council currently provides a hot and cold meals service for both its Education and Commercial Catering sites and require a range of Equipment to deliver these services. These include industrial dishwashers, Fridge Freezers, Mixers, sinks It is essential that we secure the best possible price and quality to ensure maximum return to the Council. This Dynamic Purchasing Solution (DPS) will be in place for 10 years with an average yearly spend of £70,000 and total over the 10 years of no more than £700,000 .Money spent on this contract is from revenue not capital. The establishment of a dynamic purchasing system (DPS) by the Council will allow it to call-off heavy equipment catering equipment as and when necessary up to a maximum total spend of £700,000 and the use of DPS is in accordance with public procurement rules and the Council's Contract Procedure Rules . Finance Advice:	Nottingham City Council currently provides a hot and cold meals service for both its Education and Commercial Catering sites and require a range of Equipment to deliver these services. These include industrial dishwashers, Fridge Freezers, Mixers, sinks.
	This agreement allows the Director of Education services to award contracts for 10 years to have an open dynamic purchasing agreement in place. This Dynamic Purchasing Solution (DPS) will be in place for 10 years with an average yearly spend of £100,000 and total over the 7 years of no more than £700,000.
	The proposal is to purchase 2nd hand equipment and deliver food quality improvements at a lower price than buying new equipment as many of kitchens need replacement of catering equipment.
	Nottingham Catering currently spends approximately £60,000 per annum for the procurement of new cooking and catering heavy equipment in schools and commercial catering locations.
	It is essential that the service secures the best possible price and quality to ensure maximum return to the Council Advice provided by Paul Stevenson (Interim Strategic Finance Business Partner) on 26/09/2023.
Procurement Advice:	Request to establish dynamic purchasing system for the provision of Supply of New and Used Heavy Equipment for use in Schools Catering and Commercial Cafes does not pose any procurement risk to the Council. The length of the contract and value mean that a full procurement process will be undertaken to establish the DPS. Procurement will support to establish a compliant vehicle to provide best value.
