pumps. DESNZ is committed to delivering support nationally to provide stimuli to

Training Providers to reach UKs 2050 Net Zero target ambitions.

MNZH is well placed to continue the delivery and monitoring of the scheme, this will generate revenue, through the agreed DDM and MoU signed between the parties and the continuation of the consolidation of jobs in Nottingham.

Not to accept this grant it would represent a loss in revenue and the successful continuation of the delivery the Midlands Net Zero Hub has proven for the scheme.
