	other contracts, hence the desire to have everything under one contract from the framework.

	The recommendation is to commence a sub-science of the comment contract with NEC (formarks North rate) to maxide the startegies
Finance Advice:	The recommendation is to approve a one-year extension to the current contract with NEC (formerly Northgate) to provide the strategic housing management system. This is a key management system which provides essential information in respect of tenants, repairs, rents and service charges.
	During the extension period a full review will be undertaken to assess the future statutory and regulatory information required by tenants and the Regulator of Social Housing. It is envisaged that once the review is complete and alternative systems evaluated a new long-term contract will be entered into with the successful provider.
	The revenue cost of maintaining the housing management system including licence fees and technical support is financed from the HRA. There is currently sufficient budgetary provision in the HRA to meet the full cost of the one-year extension.

Procurement Advice:	Procurement of a new NEC Housing contract will be done so via a complaint route to market calling-off the CCS VAS Framework (RM6259) via direct award. Direct award is permissible under the Framework as long as the organisations requirements can be met against the offer on the e-Marketplace and best value can be demonstrated. Entering into a new 1-year contract with NEC is the most economic and efficient option to maintain BAU and not have the costs incurred by change. It is also in keeping with the CPRs. Procurement will undertake all the necessary steps to ensure the process is followed compliantly and due diligence is undertaken on the preferred supplier. I have no procurement concerns.
	Going forward it is the intention to develop a strategy on how to secure a longer term contract from April 2025. Advice provided by Louise Dobson (Lead Procurement Officer) A on 20/03/2024.
