As a Licensing Authority for the purposes of the Gambling Act 2005, the Council is required to				
produce and publish a Statement of Gambling Policy (the Statement). A new policy is required to				
come into force for the three-year period commencing 31st January 2025 and is required to go				
through a consultation process prior to its adoption. The proposed draft Statement is attached to				
this report for approval prior to it being submitted to Full Council on 8 July 2024 for release for				
public consultation. Details of the method of consultation are set out in the report.

1. Reasons for recommendations

- 1.1 It is a statutory requirement that the Council, as Licensing Authority, adopt a new Statement of Policy relating to gambling to come into effect from the 31st January 2025.
- 2. Other options considered in making recommendations

2.1 None, it is a statutory requirement.

3. Consideration of Risk

3.1 It is a statutory requirement of the authority to publish a Statement of Gambling Policy.

4. Background (including outcomes of consultation)

- 4.1 The Council is a 'Licensing Authority' for the purpose of the Act and is required to produce and publish a Statement of Gambling Policy. A new policy is required to come into force for the three-year period commencing 31st January 2025.
- 4.2 Section 349 of the Act requires an Authority to prepare, consult widely upon and publish a Statement of its Gambling Policy every three years. Such a statement must be published before the Authority carries out any function in respect of individual applications made under the terms of the Act. During the three-year period, the statement must be kept under review and the authority may make such revisions to it as it considers appropriate. The Statement is a matter which is not the sole responsibility of the Executive and only the Licensing Authority (full council) can adopt, review, and revise it.
- 4.3 The purpose of the Statement is to inform individuals making applications for licences, of the Authority's standards and values in promoting the licensing objectives within the framework of the Act and approved guidance issued by the Gambling Commission under the Act. It sets out the Authority's approach to regulation having taken into account local circumstances.
- 4.4 Before determining any amendment to its Gambling Policy, the Licensing Authority must consult with:
 - The chief officer of the police for the area;
 - One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons carrying on gambling businesses in the authority's area; and
 - One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons who are likely to be affected by the exercise of the authority's functions under this Act.
- 4.5 Proposed amendments consist of:
 - Retention or disposal of 'No Casino Resolution'
 - Demographic update
 - Legislative update and administrative amendments
- 4.6 It is proposed that consultation on the proposed amendments should last for a period of 8 weeks, commencing Friday 12th July 2025 and concluding at midnight on Friday 6th September 2025.
- 5. Finance colleague comments (including implications and value for money)
- 5.1 The fees levied for the Gambling policy are intended to include any costs from the review of the Statement of Gambling Policy. The costs delivering the gambling regime itself are recovered from application fees that have been set within the statutory fee limits. The decision seeks to start the consultation period and therefore there is no perceived impact on the Medium Term Financial Plan.
