Decision Being Taken:

SSBC are a strategic partner of NCC/Early Help services.
SSBC have taken the decision to provide grant funding to NCC to increase staffing capacity in Early help, to support the development of the City wide Early help Partnership. To approve the acceptance of additional grant funding from SSBC for Early Help servicesTo approve spend for the recruitment of additional staff to increase service capacity. The funding will be provided by Small Steps Big Changes to recruit a Service manager and a programme Manager.

Legal Advice:	The report seeks approval to accept additional grant funding for Early Help Services to approve spend for the recruitment of additional staff to increase service capacity. The funding will be provided by Small Steps Big Changes to recruit a service manager and a programme manager. The funding has been made available through SSBC to support the development and delivery of Early help and partner services in the City. The role will enable internal restructure for Early help services and enable greater aligned with partners across the City. The internal restructure will also enable the service to look at future options to secure the roles on a permanent basis. The proposal raises no significant legal concerns and is supported. 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## **Finance Advice:**

The Early Help SSBC fund is a grant value of £300,000. This grant is allocated for two years period covering 24/25 and 25/26. The grant money will be utilised to cover 2 fixed term posts of Service manager and a Program Manager. Both posts are required to deliver the Early Help priorities. These two post are newly created fixed term contracts that will cost the council per annum in between £121,492 to £129,979 for 24/25 £123,417 to 131,904 for 25/26.

The amount of the grant will cover any future pay award.
