3 Year Moving Traffic Enforcement (MTE) Programme of Highway Investment


£600,000 over 3 years - £200,000 per Annum (Type: Nil)

Decision Being Taken:

Following the Executive Board approval in October 2023 to utilise and enact the use of the Department for Transport (DfT) Moving Traffic Enforcement Powers, this decision relates to approving a 3 year Moving Traffic Enforcement programme of investment that will enable the purchase of supporting ANPR infrastructure which is required as part of utilising and implementing the powers at the proposed sites agreed as part of the approval. The infrastructure will support highway safety which is a key component of the new powers. All expenditure will be funded from surplus Moving Traffic Enforcement ring fenced income.

To note that Spend approval will be sought from the spend control board once the application through the supplementary procedures for ring fenced income has been accepted.

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The use of surplus income from parking charges and penalty charges is governed by section 55 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Once the need for provision of operational facilities have been met, the use of any surplus is confined to the provision of road improvements or public transport services.

This type of revenue cannot be forecasted against but can exceed its expectations. The use of any surplus is ringfenced under legislation. Any request or project that requires funding from MTE surplus must be correctly identified as such under a robust and clear governance process that not only demonstrates best value but also falls within legislation. A 3-year programme of investment would allow a clear application process to be followed with an auditable evidence trail and spend approval would be sought from the spend control board prior to any project commencement.

Applications for MTE highway improvements that meet the ringfenced criterion would be categorised into four main groups: Safety, Capacity, Accessibility and Amenity. Four sites were highlighted in the application for additional moving powers and once approval is agreed we will work with Procurement to establish a purchasing programme of new ANPR units and software that provides Best Value to the authority in the long term.

Legal Advice:	Subject to the funding being confirmed as surplus derived from bus lane contraventions and/or moving traffic contraventions, and subject to the ongoing compliance with the Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022, in particular regulation 31 in the use of surpluses, this report presents no significant legal concerns.

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Finance Advice:

This decision requires the approval to spend £600k over a period of 3 financial years. There is a permanent annual budget to allow for this spend which is reported in a ring fenced account for the Bus Lane Enforcement which also forms part of the Special Parking Account. There is currently a reserve balance of £2.093m in the Moving Traffic Enforcement ring fenced reserve.as As closedown is complete, a transfer to reserve of £932,368 has been agreed in principal. This is the surplus income above expenditure for 23/24. This will bring the Moving Traffic Reserve to £3,026,175. It is a regular occurrence for income to cover eligible costs in year. However, as this is eligible revenue spend to administer the enforcement of the bus lanes, if ever in an over spend position was to occur, the legislation states that funds can be drawn down from the ring fenced reserve for this purpose. Therefore I see there will be no negative impacts to the MTFP for at least the next 3 financial years. Advice provided by Michelle Pullen (Commercial Business Partner) on 22/05/2024.
