Reasons for Decision and Background Information	
The on street and surface car parks parking infrastructure (pay stations and management system, mobile payment option) is out of formal contract. However, we need to have a maintenance agreement, data connection and transactional charges contract in place and the ability to purchase/instruct generals repairs (outside of maintenance contract) and peripherals, software updates etc. to ensure continued operation of these income generating on and off-street sites.	
This approval will give the time needed for the service area to undertake a full review of the parking infrastructure and payment mechanisms across all of its assets both on and off street as they are nearing end of life, this review and procurement process will take around 2 years to complete including installation of

and will be awarded the contract through the ESPO Procurement Framework as agreed and discussed with Procurement.

Breakdown of costs:

Yr 1 Maintenance Agreement £27,778

Yr 1 Data Connection £16,170

Yr 1 Peripherals and Transactional Charges £84,000

Yr 2 Maintenance Agreement £30,834

Yr 2 Data Connection £ 17,140

Yr 2 Peripherals and Transactional Charges £89,000

There is a contingency increase of 4% added to the Transactional Charges as data is indicating a shift from the multi-storey car parking to on street parking.

On street parking generates 54% of the parking team's income, these cost associated with this contract will be covered by the revenue budget all ready in place for these operational costs.

Other Options Considered and why these were rejected

Obtain repair quotes at the point of requirement – this solution is not available and would put the equipment at risk of disrepair

Undertake a procurement exercise for this contract – this would not meet the immediate need for a fit for purpose maintenance agreement and would put the equipment at risk of disrepair.

Do nothing - would put the equipment at risk of disrepair.

To ensure this frontline income generating service remains operational for its customers, staff and citizens of Nottingham

The 2 year maintenance agreement as per detailed above is already budgeted for in the MTFP. These Maintenance costs are eligible to be paid from the Special Parking Account (SPA) which allows the income from Parking fees to offset spend such as this. In the unlikely event that this service was to over spend, there is a ring-fenced reserve available to allow any draw down to ensure there is no negative impact to the General Fund. Therefore this is supported.
