As outlined by the report author, this decision seeks approval for expenditure of **£684,085** over a 5 year period 1st April 2025 to 31st March 2030.

The maximum cost of this decision is **£684,085** and will be funded from the Public Health Ring Fenced Grant in accordance with the conditions of the grant. If the grant was to reduce in future years, the service will need to realign services within the revised funding limit to ensure no financial pressures arise.

The decision is also to approve a procurement process. The contract will be an initial 3 years with a 2 year extension. Value for money will need to be considered during the tender process.

The actual costs associated with this decision will require regular monitoring from the service to ensure there is no financial pressure or risk of overspend.
