1.	Summary			
1.1	In May 2024 Council established a number of committees and joint bodies for the municipal year 2024/25, including approval of their membership and named substitutes. In accordance with legislative requirements, following a change to the composition of political groups represented on the Council, a recalculation of political balance and the implications of this for the allocation of seats on committees has been undertaken.

There are two councillors who are not a member of a political group.

- 2.2 To note the allocation of seats on Council committees and joint committees to political groups as set out in Appendix 1.
- 2.3 To note that, in accordance with the allocation of seats to political groups as set out in Appendix 1, Councillor Salma Mumtaz is no longer a member of the Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire and Rescue Authority; and to appoint Councillor Andrew Rule as a member of the Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire and Rescue Authority.

3. Reasons for recommendations

3.1 The recommendations support compliance with legislative requirements for the allocation of seats on Council committees, as set out in the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1980. Following notification of change in membership of a political group since the Council's Annual Meeting in May 2024, a recalculation of political balance and a review of the implications of this for the allocation of seats on Council committees to which political proportionality rules apply has been carried out.

7. Background (including outcomes of consultation)

- 7.1 Council has established a number of committees to discharge some of its non-executive functions. Details of these committees and the functions delegated to each committee can be found in Article 9 Non-Executive Functions and Committees of the Constitution. Council has also delegated some functions to joint committees and details of the functions delegated to these joint committees can also be found in Article 9.
- 7.2 Council is responsible for appointing the membership of the committees that it has established. Seats on Council committees must be allocated in compliance with legislation which requires that, for most committees, the allocation of seats to political groups reflects the relative strength of those groups on the Council, as far as is reasonably practicable. The allocation of seats on some committees, for example Licensing Committee and the Health and Wellbeing Board, is governed by other legislation and political balance is not required.
- 7.3 The main legislation which governs whether political balance is required in the allocation of committee seats and how it is calculated is the Local Government and Housing Act 1989. This set out four principles that must be observed:

- i) Where some or all of the members of the Council have formed into two or more political groups, then no committee can have members from just one political group.
- ii) Where a majority of members of the Council are members of one political group, that political group must have a majority of seats on each committee.
- iii) As long as there is consistency with the first two principles, the number of seats allocated to each political group on all of the Ordinary Committees taken together, must be as near as possible proportionate to their strength on the Council.
- iv) As long as there is consistency with the first three principles, the number of seats allocated to each political group on each individual committee must be proportionate to their strength on the Council.
- 7.4 A political group is a group of two or more councillors who have notified the Proper Officer that they wish to form a group. Where there are councillors who do not belong to a political group, Council will appoint any unallocated/left over seats from amongst the councillors who belong to no political group.
- 7.5 Alternative arrangements for the allocated of seats can only be approved by a unanimous vote of Council.
- 7.6 Appointments to the seats allocated to political groups on each Council committee for the forthcoming municipal year are made at the Council's Annual Meeting. The Constitution then enables the Director of Legal and Governance to approve in-year changes to committee memberships, either at the request of the relevant political group or because a member ceases to be eligible for membership. Such changes are reported to the next meeting of Council.
- 7.7 In May 2024 Council appointed councillors to seats on Council committees for the municipal year 2024/25, based on the political balance at that time. The resignation of Councillor Shuguftah Quddoos from the Labour Group in November 2024 changed the composition of political groups and required a recalculation of political balance and a review of the implications of this for the allocation of seats on committees to which political proportionality rules apply.
- 7.8 Following a change to the membership of political groups, the relative strength of political groups on the Council is now as follows:

Labour Group 89.09% (49)

Nottingham Independents and Independent Group 7.27% (4)

There are two councillors who are not a member of a political group.

7.9 The allocation of seats to political groups in accordance with the principles of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 for each of the committees to which this applies is set out at Appendix 1. The impact of this on the appointments made by Council in May 2024 is that the Labour Group has one less seat on the Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire and Rescue Authority, and the Nottingham Independents and Independent Group gain one seat on that Authority. There are no unallocated/ leftover seats for councillors not a member of a political group to be appointed to. As nominated by the relevant political groups, Council is asked to note that Councillor Salma Mumtaz will no longer be a member of the Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire and Rescue Authority; and approve

Councillor Andrew Rule as a member of the Nottinghamshire and City of Nottingham Fire and Rescue Authority.
