Step Into Work Programme:

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT FUNDING

What is it:

- The programme provides one to one support, advice and training to help unemployed young people (18-24) develop jobs skills and find work

Who is it for:

- Any young person who is unemployed (less than 12 months) and looking to move into work

What will young people be doing: Getting support to help them get job ready, including;

- Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG)
- One to one support
- Develop job skills – Interview Skills, CV writing, functional skills

Where is it being delivered:

- In partnership between Futures and City College Nottingham



Step Into Work Programme: Cont.

What has happened so far:

- Contract commenced 1st December 2014
- CCN official launch 28 January 2015
- 14 young adults on the programme: 10 self referrals and 4 referrals by Futures
- 11 young adults awaiting assessment
- 2 young adults into an Apprenticeship role since February 2015

Area Job Plan

As part of Nottingham City Councils wider employment and skills agenda, City College Nottingham are in the early stages of developing an Area 6 Jobs Plan.

- City College will work with other community organisations and partners to embed Ward action plans.

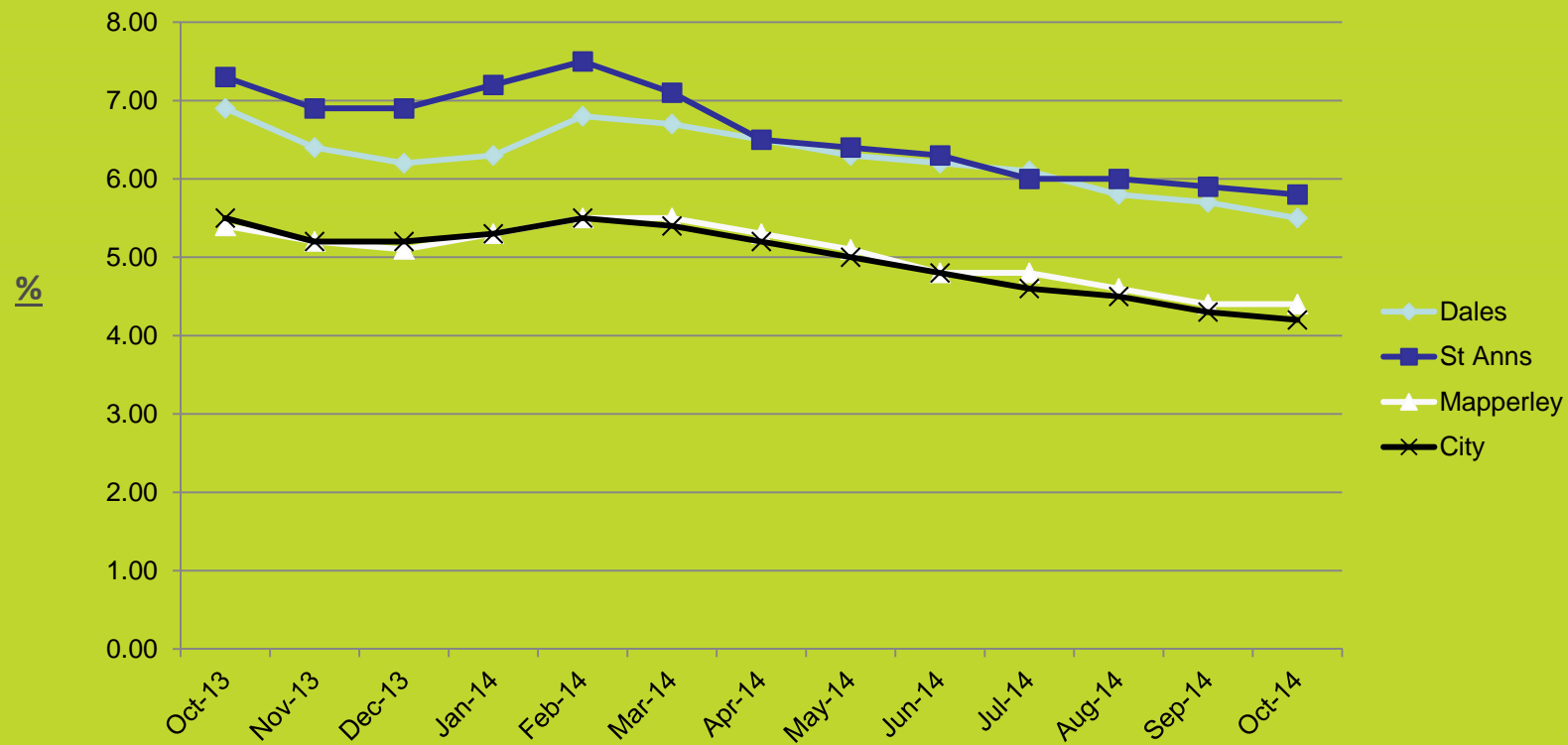

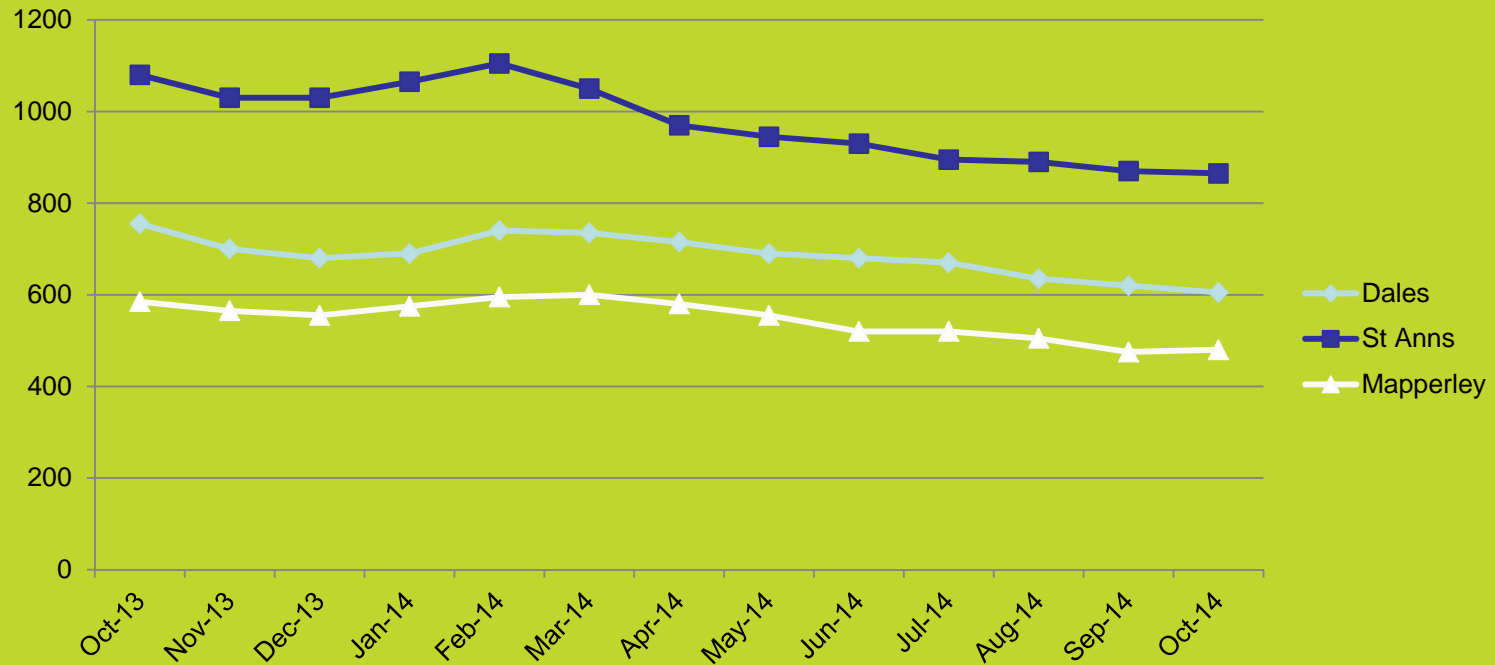
