<b>Decision Being Taken:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Approve the spend of £23,050 on repairs to damaged railings at the Forest Recreation Ground.</li><li>2. Give delegated authority to the Director of Sport, Culture and Parks to place orders relating to this work.</li></ol>
<b>Reasons for the Decision(s)</b>	Two sections of historic railings at the Forest Recreation Ground were damaged in late 2014 by a vehicle accidents. Quotes for the repair of these areas were obtained by Carillion Plc who are working on the Sports Zone part of the site at present. It is proposed to place an order for £23,050 with Bonsers Restoration who are experts in the repair and conservation of historic railings. Two other companies were also approached but declined to quote.
<b>Other Options Considered:</b>	To not repair the railings - this would mean that unsightly temporary fencing panels remain in place and historic fencelines are not restored.
