1	Capital Programme & major works	External wall insulation Properties in Lenton Abbey are to benefit from external wall insulation under the Nottingham Greener HousiNG scheme. Being managed by Nottingham City Homes the work will be delivered by SBS (Sustainable Building Services) starting in late September/early October. It is a cross tenure project with a number of owner occupiers already signed up to the scheme through Nottingham Energy Partnership (NEP). The intention of the project is to install solid wall insulation and secondary energy efficiency measures (where required) helping residents to reduce their fuel bills and leading to greater carbon reduction. An information event for residents is to be arranged. The Crane Bungalows in Wollaton are to be part of the planned programme of external wall insulation work over the next two years. They are planned to start in January 2016 Fencing & Guttering Planned Programme - April/July/October/January.	Information

2	Area Regeneration and Environmental Issues	Wollaton East & Lenton Abbey Phase 2 of the hardstanding and drop crossing project due to commence on Woodside Road. NCC delivering the work as a joint scheme between NCC & NCH. This will alleviate the parking issues in this area. £1,000 funding to be agreed from the ward Environmental budget towards the upgrade of the Enderby Square allotments. This funding was previously agreed towards the upgrade of the Brook Road allotments but now needs de committing (See appendix 2). 3	Key messages from the Tenant and Leasehold Congress	 Following the recent review of TLC (the overarching tenants voice / influencing group for NCH) there have been some significant changes: The group, is now called the 'Communities in Action' group Has a wider membership to include representatives from each of the NCH customer involvement panels, from each of the recognised Tenant and Resident Associations and also includes an open invitation to Nottingham City Homes Board Members The group meet quarterly and have a stronger focus on learning/sharing, showcasing good practice and for meetings to take a more themed approach to topical issues affecting tenants and leaseholders. The first 'new style' meeting took place on 29th July and elections were carried out for the position of Chair, Vice Chair, Performance and Service Improvement representative and representatives to each of the NCH Area Committee posts.
