• The NAT partners are looking into ways of driving the ward health priority, particularly raising

the profile and accessibility of services such as Women's Aid, Small Steps/Big Changes and Equation. Engagement with local schools is to be reviewed and refreshed. Inviting service providers to every local event with be standard practice in order to 'capture' and engage with local residents. Specific events base around these priorities will be explored for this year's week of action.

WARD: Bilborough (Balloon Woods, Bilborough, Denewood and Strelley Beats) Neighbourhood Development Officer, Julianne Christou

Key Successes

- The Christmas Festival attracted hundreds of people. There was plenty to do inside and outside!
- The Bracebridge Drive Bins have been removed successfully and there has been little or no flytipping since. Great work from our Neighbourhood Operations team and the Community Protection Officers.
- Councillors, City Services, Police, Nottingham City Homes, Community Protection Officers and local school children were involved in a 'We Are Watching You' Dog Poo campaign in January.
- Local volunteers have been involved in the 'Take a Seat' campaign encouraging local shops and businesses to offer people, especially older people a sit down if they get tired or out of breath when they are out and about in Bilborough.

Emerging issues

• There are a small number of young people continuing to cause anti-social behaviour. The police, NAT partners and other agencies are working together to deal with this issue. CCTV has gone back to Bracebridge Drive.

- 7th April Family Fun Day at Harvey Hadden Sports Village.
- 23rd April Beechdale Community Centre & Tenants & Residents 2pm

What is the Neighbourhood Action Team (NAT) focusing its work on?

- The NAT continues its work on reviewing ward priorities, and the next phase will be to strengthen actions around the health theme. Looking at how to promote awareness about cancer screening and dementia both for staff and residents.
- Continuing to work with young people and how they can support older people in the Ward, through the 'Our Place Project'.
- Raising awareness about Jobs Clubs, Training and Employment opportunities.

WARD: Leen Valley (Beechdale, Ainsley And Hyson Green Beats) NDO Rob Gabbitas

Key successes

- Area capital paving improvements at The Spinney
- Improved use of CCTV to promote community safety and reduce anti social behaviour
- Ring Road improvements programme ongoing
- Commencement of new housing development Chalfont Drive
- Lighting up Aspley / Melbourne Road Christmas tree
- Working with residents on Kennington Road estate Jobs event (30th January)

Emerging issues

- Work with Bluecoat Academy and local residents to resolve ongoing parking issues various site visits and ongoing dialogue with local residents.
- Supporting a number of smaller communities to learn English as a building block for improved integration and cohesion (Vine Community Centre)
- Management and security of Beechdale Baths site (prior to redevelopment)
- Finding a solution to repairing equipment on Robert Shaw Field that has been vandalised, in order to open the field and reduce antisocial behaviour in the area.
- Parking on Ashwell Gardens and consultation on a Resident Parking Scheme
- Chalfont Drive Development and minimising disruption to residents in this area.

NAT focus

- Sustaining youth activities in the area, also linking with schools to engage young people
- Safer communities continuing to build trust between partners working across the area
- Community cohesion events eg NCH employment roadshow (28 January 2016)
- Clean ups and enforcement responses to enviro-crime
- Further developing initiatives in Kennington Road area, in partnership with Southwold School
