1 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

1.1 To reimburse the Nottingham City CCG for the costs associated with prescription medicines associated with public health commissioned services

2 BACKGROUND (INCLUDING OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION)

- 2.1 Under the Health and Social Care Act 2010 the local authority has a responsibility to commission public health services. These include: drugs and alcohol services, smoking cessation support and sexual health services, each of which involves the prescription of medications to service users. Funding for these services is included within the Public Health grant.
- 2.2 Whilst the responsibility and funding for these services lies with Nottingham City Council, the costs associated with prescribing are borne by Nottingham City CCG. These costs relate to payments to the community pharmacy where a prescription is dispensed and the cost of the prescription drugs themselves. As such, it is necessary to reimburse the Nottingham City CCG for the costs.

3 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED IN MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 Do nothing. This option was rejected as it would put at risk working relationships with Nottingham City CCG and the continuation of the administration and supply of prescription drugs associated with public health commissioned services.
- 3.2 Moving to a pooled budget arrangement. This option is being considered for 2016/17 as part of the integration of health and social care programme.

4 FINANCE COMMENTS (INCLUDING IMPLICATIONS AND VALUE FOR MONEY/VAT)

- 4.1 Payment of £548,000 for 2015/16 Q3 and Q4. This is in addition to £548,000 for Q1 and Q2 paid through DDM2302 on 14/01/2016, a total of £1,096,000 for 2015/16.
- 4.2 These costs have been included within the Public Health budget for 2015/16.
