Decision Being Taken:

1. To authorise the use of the section 106 open space contribution totalling £95,016.52 linked to the planning permission for Breconshire Dyeworks (ref 09/03300/POUT) towards the works in Basford ward detailed in the first table in Appendix 1;2. To authorise the use of the section 106 open space contribution totalling £61,202.80 linked to the planning permission for the Frontage, Queen Street (ref 15/01349/PFUL3) towards the works in Bridge ward detailed in the second table in Appendix 1;3. Delegate authority to the Director of Sport & Culture to issue and award tenders and sign orders for the above spend.4. Amend the capital programme to reflect the expenditure detailed.

Reasons for the Decision(s)

£95,016.52 of Section 106 funding was received by the Council from the Breconshire Dyeworks site in October 2015. The terms of the relevant agreement require the Council to use the monies towards the provision and/or enhancement of open space within the City of Nottingham

£61,202.80 of Section 106 funding was received by the Council from the development at The Frontage, Queen Street in August 2016. The terms of the relevant agreement require the Council to use the monies towards the restoration of the Victoria Embankment Memorial Gardens.

- 1. Recommendation 1 seeks authority to use section 106 monies linked to the Breconshire Dyeworks development (ref 09/03300/POUT)in improvement works at a nature reserve (including the creation of a pond), a park and two separate sets of allotments. As stated in "Reasons for the Decision", the relevant s106 agreement requires the Council to use the monies "towards the provision and/or enhancement of open space within the City of Nottingham".
- 2. The Government's Planning Policy Statement 8 (PPS8) at Annex 8 defines open space as "all open space of public value including not just land, but also inland bodies of water such as rivers, canals, lakes and reservoirs..." Annex A of PPS8 then illustrates the broad range of open spaces which are of public value by a list which includes allotments and natural and semi-natural urban green spaces including woodlands, urban forestry and grasslands. It is therefore considered that the proposed use of the section 106 contribution at Recommendation 1 is compatible with the terms of the agreement from which that contribution derives.
- 3. Recommendation 2 seeks authority to use section 106 monies linked to the Frontage development (ref 15/01349/PFUL3) on works at Victoria Embankment Memorial Gardens including statue restoration, creation of new paths and repairs to existing ones, planting and gate repairs. As stated in "Reasons for the Decision", the relevant s106 agreement requires the Council to use the monies towards the restoration of the Victoria Embankment Memorial Gardens and it is clear therefore that the decision is compatible with the terms of the agreement.
- 4. The decision is within the key responsibilities of the Portfolio Holder for Leisure and Culture and also within his financial threshold.

This decision seeks approval to incur expenditure as follows:

£95,016.52 to be spent at Whitemoor Nature Reserve, Stockhill Park, Stockhill Park, Stockhill Circus allotments and Whitemoor & Bagthorpe allotments. The expenditure at these sites will be funded from Section 106 income received by the Council in December 2015, as a result of a condition on planning application approval reference 15/01349/PFUL. The project was approved at the Area 2 Basford & Bestwood Area Committee meeting on 21 September 2016.

£61,202.80 to be spent on the Victoria Embankment Memorial Gardens, funded from Section 106 income received by the Council in August 2016 as a result of a condition on planning application approval reference 09/0330/POUT. The project was approved at the Area 8 Committee meeting on 14 September 2016.

The Head of Parks, Open Spaces & Investment Funding will put in place monitoring arrangements to ensure the expenditure will be contained within the approved funding.
