Decision Being Taken:

- 1: To award a contract to Triscan Systems Ltd for the upgrades required to the fuel island controllers and on-going annual maintenance for a period of 5 years
- 2: To dispense, in accordance with Financial Regulations 3.29, with the provisions of the contract procedure rules relating to seeking quotes (5.1.1)

Reasons for the Decision(s) The Fleet Service within Neighbourhood Services is responsible for the management of fuel to all vehicle and plant assets belonging to the Council. Fuel tanks are located at three different depots (Eastcroft, Woolsthorpe and Clifton) and dispense several different fuels including Diesel, Gas Oil (Red Diesel), AdBlue and Hydraulic Oil. Fuel Island Controllers (FICs) are devices installed between fuel tanks and fuel pumps which provide a secure means to identify, track and authorise fuel for allowed vehicles by allowed drivers. As part of the Fleet Services Improvement Programme, new units have been identified which provide the following benefits; better controls and security including the ability to set access times and limit access to certain fuel products; reduced risk of fuel loss through theft, unauthorised dispensing or incorrect fuels being used; fuel tank leak detection; and better management information allowing future efficiency through improved driver behaviour and correct allocation of charges. A robust fuel management system allows the Council to benefit from partners using our fuel and charging a management fee (for example charging and additional 3-4 pence per litre that covers the cost of the fuel management system and assets making the service broadly cost neutral). The use of an alternative supplier is not viable as any other supplier would not be able to integrate with our current fuel management system - using another supplier in this case would require the complete fuel management system to be replaced and would be both disruptive and cost prohibitive. Other Options Considered: To not upgrade the existing fuel island controllers: This would leave the council using aged assets with limited functionality. Fuel management technology has progresses significantly in the last five years providing increased security, better management information and reduced risk of loss through leaks or theft. Additionally, continued use of older equipment is likely to cost more to maintain and have increased downtime, creating

pressure on essential services such as Passenger Transport, Streetscene, Highways and Domestic Waste.
