Dear Hugh

Thank you for your letter and the work and enthusiasm the steering group is showing for this proposal.

The Council wants to ensure there is development along the north bank of the Trent, within the Waterside area which will include the continuation of the riverside path from Trent Bridge along to Colwick Park. We agree with the principle of enhancing walking and cycling connections across the Trent but a proposal for a bridge would need to ensure that it does not conflict or restrict development proposals along the north bank of the Trent.

I believe officers are providing input into the business case and feasibility work, which is essential if a project of this nature is to get financial support, as there are many competing demands for funding. The Council has drawn up a comprehensive network of strategic cycle routes which we want to invest into to ensure a continued growth in cycle numbers. Therefore, the benefits and costs of a new bridge will need to be considered against the existing cycle network priorities and the many competing strategic infrastructure schemes which the Council and other D2N2 Authorities are seeking funding to deliver.

We will shortly be embarking on delivering a Local Cycling and Walking Investment Plan, this work will be undertaken in partnership with the Department for Transport. As part of this process we will look at key pieces of infrastructure, appraise them and work up a programme of schemes within the City and across the D2N2 area. This will help secure funding and allow us to plan for delivery. A new Bridge across the Trent will be considered as part of this process.
