## Re: 2018 Adult Social Care Transport Policy Consultation - Have Your Say

We are committed to supporting elderly, disabled and vulnerable people to be as independent as possible in all aspects of their lives. Travel is seen as an important aspect to retain independence and the Council is keen to support this.

We have been looking at how we support citizens with their transport needs because we believe that we can do this better by helping people to be more independent with their travel. We have also been looking at how people use their mobility benefits and transport passes to support them with their travel.

We think that by helping those who can travel independently to do so, plus encouraging citizens in receipt of mobility benefit and travel passes use them whenever possible, is the right thing to do. This will not only be better for the individual but also mean that the Council can continue to support those citizens who need support with the limited money available.

To make this happen we want to introduce an adult social care Transport Policy. This will be a guide to make sure that when we support people with their transport needs, we do so in a way that promotes independence while ensuring that we spend the available funding carefully.

## What could this mean for me?

For now, nothing is about to change but we do want you to let us know your thoughts on:

- Whether or not citizens should be supported to use public transport where it is safe to do so.
- Asking citizens who can afford to pay for their transport to do so.

- Asking citizens whether or not it is right for them to use their mobility benefits for their transport needs.
