Decision Being Taken:

- 1. To bid for the Growth Hub 2 ERDF grant and, if the bid is successful, to act as the accountable body.
- 2. Delegate authority to the Strategic Director Economy to negotiate and sign the grant agreement with MHCLG and agreements with its delivery partners and to allocate funding to those partners.
- 3. Delegate authority to the Strategic Director Economy to implement a grant award policy and award grants as the accountable body.
- 4. To commit £49,000 of match funding from existing reserves including from Growth Hub 1 project.

Reasons for the Decision(s)

This is a continuation project of Growth Hub 1, where Nottingham City Council is the accountable body for the D2N2 Growth Hub. This involves receiving the grant from MHCLG, making payments to partners (Notts County Council, East Midlands Chamber, Derby City, Derbyshire County, South Derbyshire Council, Erewash Council, Chesterfield Council and Derbyshire Dales Council). The Growth Hub is a successful LEP wide initiative which supports businesses across the region, boosting productivity and growth. Nottingham City Council has acted as the accountable body for the past 2 years. Continuing this role will give the Growth Hub continuity. The accountable body role is paid for partly through the ERDF grant and partly through match funding from LEP/BEIS (Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy). Risks are managed partly by service level agreements with delivery partners, regular internal review meetings and performance management through the Growth Hub board and LEP board. We have a successful track record and zero claw back to date.

Legal Advice:

As the accountable body the City Council will be responsible for compliance by its delivery partners with the terms of the Growth Hub 2 grant funding rules. The City Council should put in place a partnership agreement with its partners which enables the City Council to hold those partners to account and to recover any grant funding from them in the event the City Council is subject to financial clawback. The City Council should have a scheme in place to enable organizations to bid for grant awards and have grant agreements with successful bidders to enable the City Council to monitor and report on the use of the grant funding and as with its delivery partners to recover funding in the event the City Council is subject to financial clawback. Finance Advice:

The Council are already Accountable Body for Growth Hub 1 grant and therefore this bid is an extension of current arrangements. The match funding that is required is available and not earmarked for other purposes, and the GH1 reserve will be earmarked to ensure that the money is kept for this purpose. An Officer has responsibility in Economic Development for monitoring and managing the Grants within the section, ensuring all appropriate records are kept and that the Council is not at risk of financial clawback, reducing the risk to the Council.
