### **Deputyship Service Charging Policy**

The Deputyship Team provide a service to some of Nottingham's most vulnerable adults who require safeguarding and lack the Mental Capacity to manage their own financial affairs and property. The team undertake this duty of a 'Public authority Deputy' when authorised to do so by the Office of the Public Guardian 'OPG'. The team only undertake this duty when the citizen does not have anyone within their own family or social network. At present the team manage approximately 240 cases.

The Fees and Charges that Public Authority Deputies are able to levy are contained within Court of Protection 'Practice Direction B -Fixed Costs in the Court of Protection' (Appendix A) This sets out the fixed amounts of re-numeration that may be claimed by public authorities appointed to act as Deputy. A Policy has now been drafted which requires ratification. (Appendix B)

#### **Deputyship clients**

The Deputyship currently has 240 citizens, all of whom lack the Mental Capacity to manage their own property and/or financial affairs. The lack of mental capacity has to be due to 'an impairment of, or a disturbance in the functioning of, the mind or brain' as defined by the Mental Capacity Act 2005.

As noted in Appendix C, over 50% of citizens have a learning disability or mental health problem. The other citizens will have some other disorder of the mind which

- 1. All Deputyship clients receive an annual review from the Deputyship Team. Part of the review process is to ensure that the client is in receipt of all appropriate benefits and therefore income is maximised. Spending plans are also reviewed to ensure clients are in receipt of the appropriate income to meet their needs. Reviews will be initiated at the request of the client or representative more frequently if required.

Under the proposed updated Charging Policy Nottingham City Council will levy the maximum Fees and Charges as specified in the Practice Direction, on the anniversary of the court order appointing the local authority as Deputy.  4. This will impact upon clients income and assets. However the Charging Policy has a threshold in place, and allows for the waiving of additional fees where payment of such would cause the citizen to fall below a minimum asset level.
