Total Value:

Decision Being Taken:

- 1) To approve additional funding of £150,00.00 for the Claremont Heating project, to allow the project to progress.
- 2) To approve additional funding of £330,000.00 for reception area improvements and drain investigation works at Southglade Primary School.3) To approve the procurement of both these schemes through the lower band of the Regional Scape Framework.

Reasons for the Decision(s)

Claremont

Claremont is an old Victorian-style building on three floors. The heating system has been a problem over the last few years. Within this time the boilers have been replaced, but the piping is deteriorating and is now in need of replacement.

Southglade

The existing layout of the school reception does not allow for the secure management of entry into the building. This poses safeguarding risks to pupils and staff at the school and also has health and safety implications. The additional funding is needed to investigate drains that are overflowing and posing as a health and safety risk for the school.

Other Options Considered:

- 1) Phasing the works: Phasing the works at Claremont over a number of years would considerably increase the project cost, programme, and would not prove value for money. Phasing the works at Southglade may leave the reception in a more vulnerable position in terms of managing the reception and have further safeguarding/health and safety implications. For these reasons, this option was rejected.
- 2) Do nothing: This option restricts both schools significantly as works are required to ensure the schools operate in a safe environment. The drains at Southglade pose as a health and safety issue and need immediate investigation. For this reason, the option was rejected.
