ADOPTION OF THE PLANS SET OUT IN THE LABOUR MANIFESTO AS THE BASIS OF COUNCIL POLICIES

1 SUMMARY

- 1.1 The City Council is required to adopt policies for the current term of office.
- 1.2 There is a clear mandate from the people of Nottingham as a result of the election on 2 May 2019 to adopt plans in the Nottingham Labour manifesto as a basis for those policies.
