City Centre and Neighbourhood Bin Replacement Programme

Project Proposal

To replace the Belly Bins we currently have in the City Centre and surrounding areas. We want to offer a new, vibrant stainless steel bin that has either a 120 Litre or 240 Litre bin housing capacity. The replacement bins will provide a befitting and easy way for the residents of Nottingham to dispose of any litter or waste while in the City Centre. This will lead to a reduction in litter; staining and any associated cleansing issues that we currently experience with the Belly Bins. The stainless Bins also fit in with the range of Street Furniture in the City Centre and forms part of the wider City Centre vision.

Why Now

The existing City Centre Belly bins are coming to the end of their useful life and looking increasingly unsightly. Overflowing litterbins, particularly at weekends next to fast food outlets has been cited as an issue by Citizens and Colleagues. This has been an issue with the Belly Bins as on occasions, the chute can become blocked or people leave litter around it because they do not want to touch the chute handle. There is also the issue of stubbing out cigarettes, which makes the solar panel unsightly. The new Stainless Steel Bins will be able to collect more litter and will require much fewer visits by operatives to empty the bins.

The Chosen Sites for the Big Belly Bins

We are looking at an initial replacement of 40 Bins around the City Centre

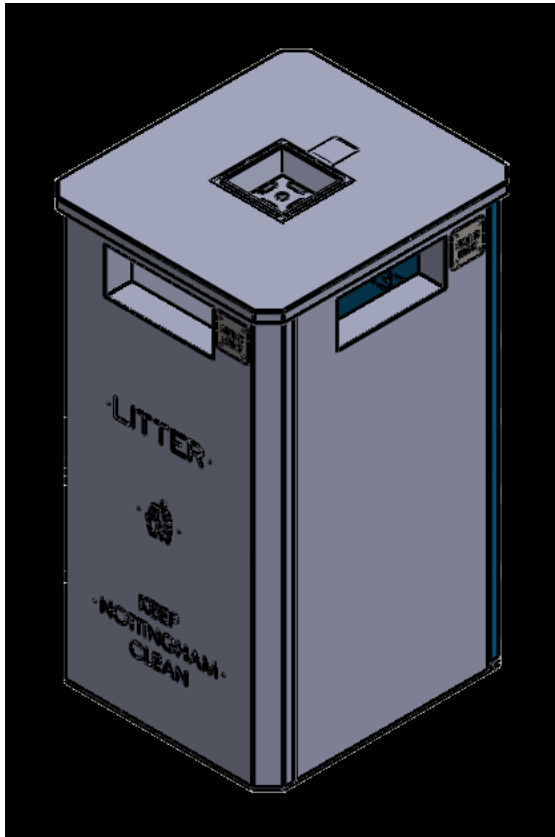

The Bin Types and Styles

We will be looking to implement two sizes of Stainless bins.

They are 240 and 120 Litre Housing bins. This means that the bin covers will be able to take 120 & 240 wheelie bins.

Specification for both bins



Stainless Steel GRADE 316

- 10mm Galv baseplate with 4 No anchoring points.
- 4 Stub Plates to the sides for use by wheelchair users. (with Stub it bin it sign —if possible)
- Slam lock
- Slight peaked lid with large stubber plates to all four sides
- Full size stainless steel pitched Ashtray —self-emptying if possible
- Punched Litter & Tidyman Logo to the front and rear
- Full enclosed Aperture structure
- Backing plate
- Keep Nottingham clean or Help make Nottingham clean logo front and rear.

Project Programme

We have estimated a working budget for the bin replacement of c £160,000.

The purchase of these bins will take place over 4 years. We plan to purchase c40 bins each year over the next 4 years to replace between 160 and 170 Belly Bins.

The purchase of these bins will be absorbed within the existing revenue budget, which currently stands at £30,000 per year.

As it stands, the rough guide price for the Stainless Steel Bins are as follows.

For 120 L
QTY 1 X £885
QTY 40 X £820

For 240 L
QTY 1 X £1650
QTY 40 X £1450

We ideally want to source and purchase the 240 Litre sized Stainless Bins and we currently have additional resources to add to the tune of an extra £10,000 from the HCLG High street community clean-up fund

It is hoped that over the next 4 years, we will continue to source contributions from partners and stakeholders to enable us secure any project shortfalls as the current Belly Bins are moved to the Neighbourhoods and Parks. This will mean that any additional income we receive for any bin replacement or bin installation can go towards the purchasing of these stainless bins.
