A major issue, and this has been discussed with the Employment and Skills Team at NCC, is obtaining the evidence for basic skills. This is being looked at as to how this can be overcome. We have clients engaged or have completed basic skills courses, but we cannot get evidence.

We have monthly review meetings with Danny Goodwin from NCC Employment and Skills Team and we attend the quarterly GA Strategy Meetings.

We will be employing a further adviser to deliver basic employment support to anyone aged 30+ in Clifton on Monday and Tuesday from 1<sup>st</sup> December under Area Based Grant.

We have just changed our IT services; our email addresses and our desk telephone numbers have been changed. This information has been publicised. We are still having an occasional hiccup, but on the whole, this has been implemented without any major issues.
